**One Philly, A United City  
Citywide Cleaning Program  
May 5, 2025, to August 1, 2025**

The Office of Clean and Green Initiatives, in collaboration with City partners including Sanitation, the Community Life Improvement Program, the Commerce Department TCB, the Police Department's Neighborhood Services Unit, Philadelphia Parks and Recreation, Philadelphia Water Department, Philadelphia Parking Authority, Licenses and Inspections, Streets, along with quasi-governmental agencies and nonprofits, will employ a proactive and holistic strategy to address the many systemic and incessant quality of life issues related to litter, illegal dumping, graffiti, abandoned automobiles, vacant lots, and nuisance properties. The goal of the comprehensive citywide cleaning and greening program called **"One Philly, A United Citywide Cleaning Program"** will be to **clean every block** in the City of Philadelphia periodically throughout the year.

**OPERATIONS PLAN SUMMARY**

The One Philly, United Citywide Cleaning & Greening Program will operate on a 13-week schedule, cleaning every block in the city. The plan utilizes the Sanitation Department's pre-established collection routes to clean each neighborhood. Cleaning teams will work, in tandem, in each sanitation district until all blocks are cleaned. Litter and trash are most visible on trash and recycling days. Cleaning teams will be assigned to a route and will be scheduled to work a day behind the area's trash and recycling collection day to maximize impact.

The goal is to clean every block shortly after their regularly scheduled trash collection. The plan is to use the Sanitation Department's established rubbish routes to implement a comprehensive cleaning strategy with collection services. This will be a coordinated effort within the entire Sanitation division to maximize cleaning services to residential neighborhoods and commercial corridors. The full-service cleaning plan has several components.

1. Preliminary notification and information of street cleaning services will be provided to the community groups, residents, and the business associations within the targeted areas. PMBC will notify residents through direct mailings and block captain meetings. The city will advertise the program through local media markets. Brochures and other related information will be emailed to residents, notifying them of the date, time and services provided. In addition, the brochures will provide contact information for volunteer participation to "Join the Fight" against litter and illegal dumping.
2. On the day following trash collection the Sanitation Department will immediately deploy clean teams made up of laborers, equipped with brooms, shovels, weed trimmers and air blowers to clean up the trash and clear fence and curb lines littered with trash. Once the hand cleaning is completed the Sanitation Department will deploy mechanical equipment including flushers and blowers to remove debris and clean the streets thoroughly.

3. Department staff – potentially in partnership with Mural Arts – will leave notices to residents that their blocks have been cleaned and offer additional information about prevention, beautification, and sustainability. All residents will be encouraged to keep their block clean and join the fight against litter and illegal dumping by participating in the city’s cleaning, greening and beautification programs that will be available on the Office of Clean and Green website linked on phila.gov and at [www.officeofcleanandgreen.org](http://www.officeofcleanandgreen.org).
4. On the following day after neighborhood scheduled trash collection, SWEEP Officers will patrol the area giving warnings and citations for deliberate violations and offer additional information to address nuisance violations. SWEEP officers will also patrol the commercial business corridors to ensure that businesses are following streets department regulations specifically regarding dumpsters, litter free sidewalks and proper trash containers for takeout vendors. SWEEP Officers will patrol prior to trash collection.
5. The Sanitation-led cleaning program will be coordinated with other City agencies to simultaneously address major quality of life issues and clean additional public spaces in each district. In each district, this will include:
  - a) Maintenance and repair of vacant lots and removal of graffiti by CLIP;
  - b) Commercial corridor cleaning by the Commerce Department’s PHL Taking Care of Business program.
  - c) Deep cleans of at least 3 neighborhood parks and rec centers by PPR;
  - d) Cleaning and lawn maintenance at between 10-20 neighborhood schools by SDP facilities teams.
  - e) Inspection, cleaning, sealing, and enforcement of nuisance properties by L+I;
  - f) Removal of unregistered and abandoned automobiles by PPA and PPD;
  - g) Green Stormwater Infrastructure (GSI) and inlet maintenance by PWD;
  - h) Pothole paving by the Streets Department; and
  - i) Transit station cleanings by SEPTA.

Each agency will be charged with tracking data and capturing the work performed so the city and partners can have a full view of the results of this effort. All of the above initiatives will ultimately be mapped and visualized.

## **DATA COLLECTION & REPORTING**

Consistent with the Mayor’s vision to govern in a way that Philadelphians can “see, touch, and feel”, our goals are to ensure that 1) all departments are capturing the work they perform as efficiently and accurately as possible; 2) that all 311 tickets are closed promptly and the backlog of 311 requests related to persistent quality of life issues is reduced through this effort; and 3) that we collectively quantify and report the results of our work to demonstrate impact to the public and foster greater levels of transparency and accountability.

To accomplish these goals, we are directing each department take the following steps:

## Use of ESRI Quick Capture Tool:

All City Departments with City-issued cell phones managed by OIT's Mobile Data Services (MDS) Team will have the ESRI ArcGIS "Quick Capture" app pushed down to their devices. City Departments and partner agencies without City-issued devices managed by MDS that will "bring their own devices" will be required to download and install the ESRI ArcGIS "QuickCapture" app from their appropriate App-download stores. The QuickCapture "2024 Citywide Cleaning" Project will be shared with participating users. These users will be responsible for taking pictures of the work performed and sending the data through the app, which will then be mapped back to a centralized geo-spatial database managed by the Office of Clean and Green Initiatives (OCG), the data will be summarized in the map shown below on [www.officeofcleanandgreen.org](http://www.officeofcleanandgreen.org) on the "Join the Fight" page.

- OCG will need the emails of responsible crew members in order to set up the required accounts.
- OCG will provide training on the use of this app to departmental crew leaders and operational staff as needed.



## CLOSING 311 EXSITING REQUESTS

In preparation for the thirteen-week summer cleaning schedule, all departments must pull existing 311 tickets from the zip codes in each week's targeted cleaning area. The cleaning schedule, map, and specific boundaries can be found in separate tabs on the master spreadsheet linked here:

- Each department should ensure that operational crews are addressing 311 requests in each area over the course of each week and that these are treated as points/areas of focus.
- All departments are required and responsible for cross-referencing the work performed through the summer citywide cleanup effort with open 311 tickets and closing those tickets accordingly.
- Note: Departments are also asked to begin taking any steps that are required in to close 311 requests (e.g., issuing notices for clean and seals) in advance of work to be performed in a given area.

## CREATING NEW 311 REQUESTS


All departments are also required to create – and then close – new 311 tickets to capture work and tasks done to ensure that *all* work is ultimately fed into the 311 system. This may be done in real-time on site, or retroactively by referring to the ESRI Quick Capture data.

Our main goal is to effectively and accurately capture the work performed by your departments, and to ensure that departments are following through on work (and specifically, outstanding 311 requests) that staff and crews are *already supposed to be completing and reporting on*. Our expectation is that the process does not entail duplication of work – beyond the taking of a picture in the ESRI app – but does entail a renewed effort to capture work and abide by reporting processes that departments are already meant to be conducting.

The Office of Clean and Green Initiatives, in partnership with OIT and Philly Stat 360, will be reviewing these expectations and discuss questions and concerns. At that meeting, we will also be asking that you identify responsible personnel within your department for both capturing data (e.g., crew leaders of operational teams) and for participating in weekly intergovernmental data review meetings to ensure that all activities are being captured, tracked, and ultimately reflected as complete in the 311 system.


