Core Principles of the Safe Systems Approach

- Human life takes priority over mobility;
- Human error is inevitable and unpredictable;
- People are inherently **vulnerable**, and **speed** is a fundamental predictor of crash survival;
- Safe street design, education, and enforcement are essential contributors to **a safe system**.

Neighborhood Slow Zones

Philadelphia's **default speed limit is 25 mph**. Neighborhood Slow Zones reduce the speed limit to 20 mph and work with neighbors to develop a plan to install traffic calming to enforce the lowered speed limit.

10th Memorial Slow Zone

- Your Slow Zone boundaries:
 - Cecil B. Moore Ave
 - N. 16th St
 - Girard Ave
 - Ridge Ave
 - N. 21st St
- Improvements must be planned <u>inside</u> the boundary streets, <u>not</u> on boundary streets.



Crash Map

- 1 fatality (pedestrian) ★
- 2 serious injuries (one pedestrian, one vehicle crash)
- **18** crashes with pedestrians
- 3 crashes with bicyclists
- **63** injury crashes
- 115 total crashes
