Dear Dr. Farnham:

Pursuant to the City's Historic Preservation Ordinance, the Philadelphia City Planning Commission must review and comment on the creation of historic districts and provide those comments to the Historical Commission to assist in its determination as to whether the designation of the district is in keeping with larger City policies and plans. On June 5, 2025, the Philadelphia City Planning Commission had the opportunity to review and comment on the proposed Blakemore Street Historic District.

Historical Commission staff member Kim Chantry presented the proposed Blakemore Street Historic District to the Planning Commission. Commissioners asked general questions about listing on the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places and what that means for property owners. Ms. Chantry explained that the historic designation of these properties will only regulate work on the exterior of the buildings and that any existing conditions can remain until a property owner chooses to undertake work. She stated that the nomination was authored by Oscar Beisert of the Keeping Society. Two members of the public asked questions, one of which was about potential job creation, and the other about the Historical Commission's lack of jurisdiction of work to the interiors of these buildings.

The Planning Commission found that the Blakemore Street Historic District is in keeping with Citywide Vision Renew 8.1.1 to preserve culturally, historically, and architecturally significant buildings, sites, structures, and districts, as well as the Upper Northwest District Plan RENEW to list historic districts and properties on the Philadelphia Register of Historic Places, focusing on themes identified by residents and other stakeholders.
