## **ANNOUNCEMENT**

The Office of the Mayor of the City of Philadelphia, the Department of Licenses & Inspections and the Plumbing Advisory Board is seeking a replacement Plumbing Advisory Board Member to fill the Sustainability Seat that is currently vacant.

Persons interested in filling this seat need to have a professional background in Sustainability that includes but not limited to water conservation, energy conservation, green roof technologies, water capturing and reuse and LEED technologies. Persons interested need not be licensed plumbers, but a working knowledge of plumbing systems and the Philadelphia Plumbing Code would be helpful. Please note residency requirements are not necessary to hold this position.

All letters and associated paperwork will be forwarded to the Plumbing Advisory Board who will then review all professional background information on prospective replacements and conduct interviews at regularly scheduled meetings of the Plumbing Advisory Board. At the conclusion of the Plumbing Advisory Board's research and through a majority consensus by the Board, we will provide all compiled information along with the Plumbing Advisory Board's recommendation to the Office of the Mayor, which may request additional information.

General information: the Plumbing Advisory Board is made up of ten individuals with varying professional backgrounds including representatives from various city departments. Seven of these Board Members are voting members. The seat which is to be filled is that of a voting member. The Plumbing Advisory Board meets officially with compensation for one meeting a month, normally on the first Thursday. Official meetings normally begin at 9:00 AM and conclude at or before 12:00 Noon. Meetings are in person at a Center City location.

On occasion, Board Members may be asked to attend interim work sessions depending upon specific tasks and research requested by the Department of Licenses & Inspection, the Office of the Mayor, Members of City Council or any other city agency requesting technical assistance in areas falling under the scope of practice of the Plumbing Advisory Board.
