

Quick Reference Guide:

Temporary Assignments for the 2025 General Election

This guide is a basic outline of how the City's political activity rules apply to Executive Branch officers & employees on temporary assignment to the Office of the City Commissioners. For more details about the political activity rules, see [ethics.pub/Reg8](#).

Political activity is activity to support or oppose a candidate, campaign, political party, or partisan political group.

Political activity is **prohibited** if you are...

- ✗ On duty
- ✗ In uniform
- ✗ In City offices
- ✗ Using City resources
- ✗ Using your City title or status

Political fundraising and political management are **always prohibited**, even if you are off duty.

As an employee of the Executive Branch,* you may volunteer in a non-management role in support of a candidate for **non-local office**.**

A temporary assignment to the Commissioners, however, will **restrict** your ability to volunteer for a candidate, campaign, political party, or partisan political group during certain periods.

*Except employees & officers of the Police Department

**Local offices are listed in Regulation 8, Paragraph 8.9(d).

If you accept a temporary assignment related to the Nov. 4 General, you may not volunteer for a candidate, campaign, political party, or partisan political group on:

1. Any calendar day **before** Oct. 25 on which you perform election-related duties
2. All calendar days from Oct. 25 through Nov. 4 **and**
3. If the assignment extends past Nov. 4, all calendar days through the last day on which you perform election-related duties.

If you have engaged in campaign activity **on or after Oct. 25**, you are **not eligible** for temporary assignment to perform duties related to the **Nov. 4 General Election**.

^ A calendar day runs from 12:00 a.m. to 11:59 p.m.
