Re: Request for Art Commission Review

We respectfully request to be included on the Art Commission agenda for October 8, 2025, for Conceptual Approval of the Lemon Hill Playground project, located at 39 State Rte 3007, Philadelphia, PA 19130.

A brief description of the project is provided below:

The project proposes replacing the existing playground with an accessible play space that integrates the site's natural slope to create a tiered play environment. Each elevation will be connected by a traversing, ADA-accessible switchback path. Along the path, nodes will be organized by target age groups, creating a safer, more approachable public space for children and caregivers. Play zones will include dedicated areas for ages 0–2, 2–5, and 5–12, as well as a shared space to encourage interaction across age groups.

Additionally, the design incorporates multiple seating and gathering zones, providing opportunities for caregivers and families to socialize and relax within a safe distance from children at play.

The estimated project budget is \$2,500,000.







MODERATE SLOPING AREA

AREA WITH A SLOPE RANGING FROM 6.5% TO 10%, WOULD REQUIRE SITE WORK INCLUDING REGRADING AND SOIL STABILIZATION TO MAKE IT ADA ACCESSIBLE



STEEP SLOPING AREA

Lemon Hill features a dramatic elevation change from the Schuylkill River, making it an ideal viewpoint. This natural topography attracted visitors, offering scenic views and a popular route for recreational hiking along the ridgeline.



JOHN C. SINCLAIR, 1870

The fish pond area was opened to the public and served as the main entrance to the park after 1844. Mature trees, along with meandering ramps and pathways following the natural topography, offer a relaxed and enjoyable walking experience.


LEMON HILL TRAIL BRIAN SCHWARZ, 2014

ADVENTURES TRAIL: RUNNING, CLIMBING, AND DISCOVERING NATURE'S PLAYSPACE

- The Switchbacks draws inspiration from Frederick Graff's 1851 zigzag trail design and Lemon Hill's history as a beloved destination for recreation and scenic views of the Schuylkill River.
- An ADA-accessible switchback trail forms the backbone of the play experience, embracing the site's existing topography to create a play environment where terrain and activity are seamlessly integrated.
- The trail is not only functional but immersive—along the trail, children encounter climbing structures, slides, swings, and natural play features that encouraging exploration, discovery, and interaction with nature.
- Switchbacks offers a bold, inclusive, and imaginative playspace—connecting past to present and landscape to play.








