#### SPEAKER BIOGRAPHY

#### Franklin M. Lee



Franklin M. Lee is a partner in the Baltimore-based law firm of Tydings & Rosenberg LLP. Prior to entering private practice in 2002, he served sixteen years as Chief Counsel for the Minority Business Enterprise Legal Defense & Education Fund, Inc. ("MBELDEF"), a national non-profit public interest law firm founded by Maryland Congressman Parren J. Mitchell to defend the class interests of the minority business community. As Chief Counselof MBELDEF, Mr. Lee was directly involved in the preparation of pleadings and briefs in Supreme Court cases in opposition to constitutional challenges to minority businessprograms. These high profile court cases included J.A. Croson v. City of Richmond, Adarand Constructors, Inc. v. Pena, and Adarand Constructors, Inc. v. Mineta.

More recently, his duties have included providing state and local governments with MBE program litigation defense, policy review, and policy development services to bring minority business programs into compliance with the law, and to implement innovative strategies for enhancing the growth trajectory and competitive viability of minority-owned businesses. As a member of Baltimore's Mayoral Advisory Council for Minority and Women Business Enterprises, he served as the Co-Chair of the Economic Development Subcommittee, and was the principal architect for recommendations calling for the establishment of a large-scale urban solar power pilot project to promote mainstream MBE participation in commercial and residential developments that will include City-financed installation of community-owned solar PV panel arrays.

Mr. Lee is a national authority on commercial nondiscrimination and MBE policies and has authored such legislation for several local governments including the Palm Beach County School District and the cities of Baltimore; San Diego; San Antonio; Columbia, SC; and Charlotte, NC. Most recently, his legislation was enacted by the State of Maryland making it the first state in the nation to adopt a commercial nondiscrimination policy.

In addition, from 1980 through1986, Mr. Lee served as a general antitrust litigation attorney for the Federal Trade Commission. He has also served on the Governor's Commission for MBE Reform and three other Maryland Legislative Task Forces on Centralized Bidder Registration, Lending Equity, and MBE Program and Investment Equity Capital. Mr. Lee holds an undergraduate degree from the University of Chicago and a Juris Doctorate from the University of Maryland School of Law.

For nearly two decades, Dan Tsao has been a driving force in uplifting Philadelphia's Asian immigrant community through both media and entrepreneurship. As founder of Metro Chinese Weekly (2007) and Metro Viet News (2008), Dan has worked tirelessly to bridge critical information gaps for immigrant communities, connecting more than 1,200 Asian-owned businesses and corporations with the region's 250,000-strong Asian population.

Through his publications and his digital platform PhillyGuide on WeChat, he has amplified voices, promoted small business growth, and fostered economic opportunity in Chinatown and beyond. When the pandemic struck, Dan responded with extraordinary leadership and service by launching RiceVan, a delivery network that sustained over 30 struggling Chinatown restaurants. Operating six days a week, RiceVan brought meals to 4,200 Asian families across suburban counties, preserving livelihoods and strengthening community ties in a time of crisis.

As owner of EMei Restaurant, Dan transformed his family business into one of Philadelphia's premier dining destinations, earning spots on Philly Magazine's Best 50 Restaurants and The Philadelphia Inquirer's 76 Most Vital Restaurants. In just three years, he increased sales by 300% and expanded the team from 12 to 37 full-time employees, creating quality jobs and championing diversity in the culinary industry.

Dan's leadership has been recognized by Good Morning America, The Philadelphia Inquirer, NBC, and other prominent outlets. A graduate of Penn State University with a degree in Communications and a minor in Visual Arts, he continues to serve as a connector, advocate, and innovator. 


# Melanie McLeod, CEC, PCC, President and Founder of Coach You Solutions

The Department of Commerce Office of Economic Opportunity (OEO) ensures that the City is working with diverse businesses to fulfill its needs for goods and services.

#### **Benefits for Businesses**

#### **Get opportunities**

After registering, OEO can connect your business with opportunities. The OEO Registry is the lifeline of the Office of Economic Opportunity housing all businesses that participate in City of Philadelphia contracting process. The OEO Registry is essential in every aspect of the City contracting process, from setting project goals to outreach for upcoming opportunities and eventually tracking participation. Your company's information is listed in the OEO Registry, which is utilized by all City departments, public, private and non-profit industries.

#### **Certify and Join the OEO Registry in Three Steps**

#### **Step One: Get Certified**

To join the registry, you must first apply for certification by one of the approved external certifying agencies. OEO will review and consider certifications from municipalities and private organizations.

Find a certification agency such as,

- Eastern Minority Supplier Development Council
- Pennsylvania Unified Certification Program
- Small Business Administration



#### Step Two: Join the Registry

After receiving your certification, you can sign up for the OEO's registry. To do this, go online and complete the FREE application, this will take roughly 30 minutes. Once the online application is completed and approved, your company will receive a registration letter by email.



#### **Step Three: Find Contracting Opportunities**

Through the City's procurement websites, you can locate opportunities for your business.
