Why Fox Chase-Burholme

Fox Chase-Burholme is a vibrant community with strong local institutions, such as schools, health centers, and parks. However, pedestrian and bicycle access to these destinations is often limited by incomplete infrastructure, high-speed traffic, and gaps in connectivity. This project aims to

- 1) **Strengthen community networks** that enable safe multimodal access to resources
- 2) Establish a **blueprint for infrastructure improvements** that enhance mobility, encourage physical activity, and improve public health outcomes

What's Next

The Plan will build on neighborhood assets like Pennypack Park, Burholme Park, and the new Fox Chase-Lorimer Trail to improve safety and connectivity for everyone. Over the next year, the project team will work with community members and local organizations to shape plan recommendations.

Timeline *(subject to change):*

- **Fall 2025 - Winter 2026:** Conduct existing conditions analysis
- **Spring 2026:** Begin public engagement and draft the plan
- **Summer 2026:** Finalize and release the Active Transportation Plan

From 2020 to 2024, the Fox Chase-Burholme area had 401 reported crashes, and nearly three-quarters resulted in injuries. People walking or biking made up two-thirds of all deaths and serious injuries. The City is developing an **Active Transportation Plan to identify projects that will make walking, biking, rolling, and taking transit easier and safer** in the neighborhood.
