- Retail Delivery Tax of **25 cents per order**
- **Charged to retailers**, on certain goods delivered in Philadelphia
- Tax will be **implemented on July 1, 2027**
- **Essential delivery items would be excluded**, including food, baby products, medications, and medical devices.

WHY IT'S NECESSARY

Fixing our streets and patching potholes costs money. This tax will fund improvements to road conditions across the city.

ABOUT THE TAX

The businesses that rely on our streets for deliveries should help pay to maintain them.

WHO BENEFITS

Improved roads will benefit commuters, residents, visitors, and businesses by making travel safer, faster, and more efficient for everyone.

CITY COMPARISONS

Philadelphia's proposed tax is in line with comparable cities:

- Minnesota: \$0.50 on any transaction over \$100
- Colorado: \$0.28 per transaction
