APPLICATION FOR SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY BENEFITS

Case of Angela DeVito, Application for Service-Connected Disability Benefits - Plan B

This is an application submitted by Angela DeVito, former Police Officer for Service-Connected Disability benefits under Pension Plan "B".

According to Ms. DeVito, on August 22, 2017 while waving her arm directing traffic and pedestrians at the Philadelphia International Airport she heard a pop in her left shoulder. Ms. DeVito states that her shoulder became very painful.

Case of Jonathan White, Application for Service-Connected Disability Benefits - Plan B

This is an application submitted by Jonathan White, former Police Officer I for Service-Connected Disability benefits under Pension Plan "B".

According to Mr. White, on July 8, 2015 he and his partner were involved in a vehicular accident. Mr. White states that the vehicle was struck from behind and the impact forced his head forward and then backward striking the headrest. Mr. White sustained multiple injuries and other complications.

Case of Alonzo J. Vincent, Request to Apply for Service-Connected Disability Benefits beyond the one-year deadline – Plan Y

This is a request from Alonzo J. Vincent, former Equipment Operator with the Water Department to apply for Service-Connected Disability benefits beyond the one-year deadline.

Alonzo Vincent separated from City service effective June 13, 2016.

The Board of Pensions received a letter from Mr. Vincent on June 15, 2020 requesting to apply for Service-Connected Disability benefits beyond the one-year deadline. He states that he did not know he had to apply within one-year and has been on Workers' Compensation from 2015.

The Board of Pensions issued an Administrative Denial letter dated June 22, 2020.

Mr. Vincent submitted a letter of appeal on June 26, 2020.

NEW BUSINESS

Executive Director's Report – Mr. Bielli stated there were seven responses to the RFP for the Auditor. The expiration date for the current Auditor contract expires on August 8, 2020. The Board would like to extend the date for the subcommittee to continue to evaluate the current responses to the RFP. When the review is completed the committee will make a recommendation to the full Board.

Virtual Hearing Procedures – Mr. Bielli stated that he thought there would be more options for the hearing process once the City went Green. However, they see now that is not the case and in order to move cases along a virtual hearing process will need to be implemented. Mr. Cousounis and Ms. Berkowitz are working on procedures and will keep the Board posted.

Board Trustee Election - Mr. Stagliano proposed a resolution to consider postponing the trustee election as some trustees will have problems getting petition signatures. The motion to introduce the resolution will be held over to the next Board meeting.

Veronica Pankey made a motion to consider a resolution to suspend the trustee election. Kellan White seconded the motion.

The motion to consider a resolution to suspend the trustee election carried unanimously 8-0.

Litigation Summary – Ms. Berkowitz stated there were no changes.

The motion to adjourn carried 8-0. The meeting adjourned at 9:47.
