What is a Surcharge?

A Philadelphia Water Department (PWD) surcharge is assessed to recover the costs of treating a customer's wastewater when its strength exceeds that of normal residential wastewater. Surcharge for Laundromats

Historic sampling investigations conducted by the Philadelphia Water Department evaluated the strength of laundromat wastewater to develop a standard surcharge for these businesses. Effective September 1, 2019 this surcharge rate (subject to change) is \$0.61915 per hundred cubic feet of wastewater (one hundred cubic feet of water = 748 gallons). This factor is multiplied by the metered water usage at your place of business to calculate the billed surcharge.

Who gets a Laundromat Surcharge?

The laundromat surcharge is applied to any commercial establishment providing wet laundering services to its customers, including but not limited to:

- Self-serve, Coin Operated Laundromats
- Drop-off Laundry Service Locations
- Dry Cleaner/Laundry**

**A business *only* providing dry cleaning services is not subject to the laundromat surcharge.
